<p>Create a poem or limerick about a Roman.</p>	<p>Find out about an Italian location and present the facts in an interesting way.</p>	<p>Write a play about a Pompeii and when Vesuvius erupted in 79AD.</p>	<p>Create a mosaic, showing an everyday object, an animal or a unique pattern!</p>	<p>The largest amphitheatre in the empire was the Colosseum. Make a sculpture using materials of your choice.</p>
