What is PE & Sport Premium funding?

The Pe & Sport Premium is additional government funding aimed at making additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer.

How much PE & Sport Premium funding did New Valley receive in 2014-15?

Last year, we received £ 8,605.

How did New Valley spend its 2014-15 PE & Sport Premium funding?

The table below shows how 2014-15 PE & Sport Premium funding was spent:

Amount	Spent on	How did this support PE and sport at New Valley?
£ 4853	Specialist sports coaches working alongside school staff	Specialist sports coaches worked alongside New Valley staff to deliver PE every week in each key stage 2 class. This was designed to: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Develop the skills and confidence of school staff in delivering high quality coaching in a variety of sports and activities;• Ensure that all children in key stage 2 benefitted from regular high quality specialist sports coaching.
£ 1009	PE and sports equipment (curriculum)	New equipment was bought to support and improve the PE curriculum, to ensure that teachers and coaches were well equipped and that children had the necessary resources to benefit fully.
£ 826	PE and sports equipment (clubs and playtimes)	New equipment was bought to improve the quality of after-school clubs, to provide better opportunities for children to benefit from a range of clubs. We also bought playground equipment (skipping ropes, balls etc) to increase activity levels at playtime and lunchtime.
£ 851	Free swimming lessons	All children in years 1-3 took part in a term of weekly swimming lessons, with no charge to families. This was designed to provide free access to lessons in this vital life skill and to increase physical activity among our children.
£ 1066	Health Week	Our successful Health Week in the summer term was aimed at raising the profile of healthy active lifestyles. Resources bought included pedometers and water bottles for each child, and we paid for additional activities, including korfbal coaching and additional swimming lessons.

What was the impact of PE & Sport Premium spending in 2014-15?

Benefits of our spending on PE and sport included:

- Increased levels of participation in clubs, both at school and outside;
- Increased proportion of children able to swim 25 metres;
- Teachers and Teaching Assistants reported greater confidence in being able to deliver PE effectively.

How is the school planning to spend its PE & Sport Premium allocation for 2015-16?

For 2015-16, we estimate that New Valley will receive £ 8,605 PE & Sport Premium funding. The table below shows how we are planning to spend our allocation:

Approximate amount	Spent on	How will this support Pupil Premium children?
£ 6443	Specialist sports coaches working alongside school staff	This year, we have extended the use of specialist sports coaches, so that they work alongside New Valley staff to deliver PE every week to all classes (except Year 4). This aims to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Develop the skills and confidence of school staff in delivering high quality coaching in a variety of sports and activities; • Ensure that all children in key stage 2 benefit from regular high quality specialist sports coaching.
£ 630	Sports coaches providing CPD for staff	A specialist sports coach will further develop the skills and confidence of teaching staff by delivering several twilight training sessions on the teaching of key skills.
£ 732	PE and sports equipment (curriculum)	New equipment will support and improve the PE curriculum, to ensure that teachers and coaches are well equipped and that children have the necessary resources to benefit fully.
£ 400	PE and sports equipment (clubs)	New equipment will improve the quality of after-school clubs, to provide better opportunities for children to benefit from a range of clubs. .
£ 400	Child involvement in cluster group sports events	This will pay for teacher release to take groups of children to sports festivals and events with other local schools
