**This week's word list:** Words with the Spelling Pattern: ee, y, ea

**Monday:** Look, cover, write, check carefully and in your best, joined handwriting

exceed treason reveal breathe release recede beneath  
adhere pioneer shield pierce feeble wreath reason  
weary appear redeem season

**Tuesday:** Complete the missing words: (This is a tricky one-all the words are in Monday's list)

**Or play the game from last week with this week's words:  
You will need to make your flashcards.**

- If you have someone to play with, shuffle up your cards and play snap.
- Pairs: divide the cards between you. One player puts down a card and the other gets to keep the pair if they have its matching meaning /spelling.
- Definitions: Your partner reads you a definition, you have to identify and spell the word. For a bonus point, use the word correctly in a sentence.

If you don't have a partner, play Pelmanism. Shuffle your cards, place them all face down in a grid pattern. Turn one card over, can you find its partner? If it matches, remove the pair from the grid. If it doesn't, turn them both back over. Repeat until you have found all the pairs.

### Wednesday:

Make up a tune or a rap to spell each word.

Try it forwards and backwards.

Make up a game to play – give the meaning and one of the letters for someone else to guess the word. They can have a point if they can then spell it. Eg. This word means words double four and the fourth letter is h?
