

Week 9 English Lesson 1

This lesson is based on Chapter 10 'Lame Betsy'

In Chapter 10, Jim goes back to find Rosie and Judd – the cook and housekeeper who were looking after his sisters. The new cook and housekeeper tell him that Rosie and Judd no longer work there. The lordship (their boss) found out that they were hiding two street children in the kitchen and fired them.

Write a play script to show the conversation that may have taken place between Rosie and 'his lordship' when he discovers Jim's sisters hiding in his house.

Features of a Play Script

Character names
Setting the scene
Stage directions
Speech
Character directions within speech

No inverted commas are needed!

The Mad Hatter, Dormouse and Hare are sitting at a table having afternoon tea. Alice enters the scene, stage left.

Mad Hatter:

(starts for a moment, pauses and a broad grin appears across his face. He gets up out of his chair and walks across the table towards Alice)

It's you.

Dormouse: (exasperated) No it's not! Hare brought us the wrong Alice!

Hare: (gasps and throws his hands against his head) It's the wrong Alice!

For example:

Rosie is in the kitchen, taking some freshly-baked bread out of the oven. Emily and Lizzie are kneading dough. His lordship bursts into the kitchen.


His lordship: (spitting with rage) What is this I hear about STREET URCHINS hiding out in my house?

Rosie: (panicked)

Reread page 87, or ask someone to read it to you.




This lesson is based on Chapter 10 'Lame Betsy'

In teardrops, write down some of the emotions that Jim may be feeling now that he has found Rosie. Try and think of at least 10 words or phrases.













Extension

For each word or phrase describing Jim's emotions, explain why you think he would be feeling that way.






