


Spelling











<u>Wake and shake</u> · There are many different videos on YouTube for wake and shake or children can follow a Joe Wicks video to get them ready for the day!



Remember to use the steps to help; step one: multiply the ones, step two: write the tens underneath, step three: multiply the tens and add the tens underneath.







Step 1: multiply the ones.



Step 2: multiply the tens. 3 x 50 = 150 so I need to add the 20 on. 150 + 20 = 170



Step 3: I write 170 but I need to remember my HTO columns.



$$5 \times 33 =$$

First I multiply $3 \times 5 = 15$

Then I write 5 in the ones column and save the 10 for later (underneath).

After I multiply 5×30 and I know that $5 \times 3 = 15$ so $5 \times 30 = 150$ because I know to add a 0 to multiply a number by 10.


I know that I need to add 10 onto 150 so the number is now 160.

Finally I write that into my columns and the total is 165.
