

<u>Wake and shake</u> - There are many different videos on YouTube for wake and shake or children can follow a Joe Wicks video to get them ready for the day!





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
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What we need to know: If I see a note then I know that this *is pounds. I can add the value* together by starting with the notes, then adding the pounds and then adding the coins.




 $\pounds 10 + \pounds 5 = \pounds 15$ $\pounds 15 + \pounds 1 + \pounds 1 = \pounds 17$ $\pounds 17 + 20p + 5p + 1p = \pounds 17.26$

The value of the pound comes first and then the pence comes after the dot.


