

We recommend you help your child to maintain the structure of their day and include an example timetable. This will help to support their learning behaviour and wellbeing.




L.O: Use a variety of coordinating conjunctions

Let's remind ourselves of what we learnt last week!

What is a coordinating conjunction?

A **coordinating conjunction** is used to join two **main clauses** together. Remember, a **main clause** is able to stand alone and makes sense by itself.

We can use the acronym **FANBOYS** to help us remember all of the coordinating conjunctions. Here they are:



Today we will be focusing on these **coordinating conjunctions**:

For

Nor

Or

How can we use the coordinating conjunctions?

For- To give a reason (It's a little bit like using because!)

Nor- To give an alternative that is untrue or not going to happen.

Or- To give an alternative (It's like using either)

Here are some examples:

Notice how two **main clauses** can be joined together by a **coordinating conjunction**.

The entire family were summoned to a Family Council meeting **for** Elder Paw had demanded that everybody should attend.

Varjak Paw did not know what Elder Paw would say **nor** did anyone else have any idea what the meeting would be about.

Varjak Paw could become like a true pedigree cat **or** he could explore the outside world like Jala.



Unlike the rest of the litter, he has yellow eyes (the sign of danger) and wants to explore the outside world.






Chapter Two
