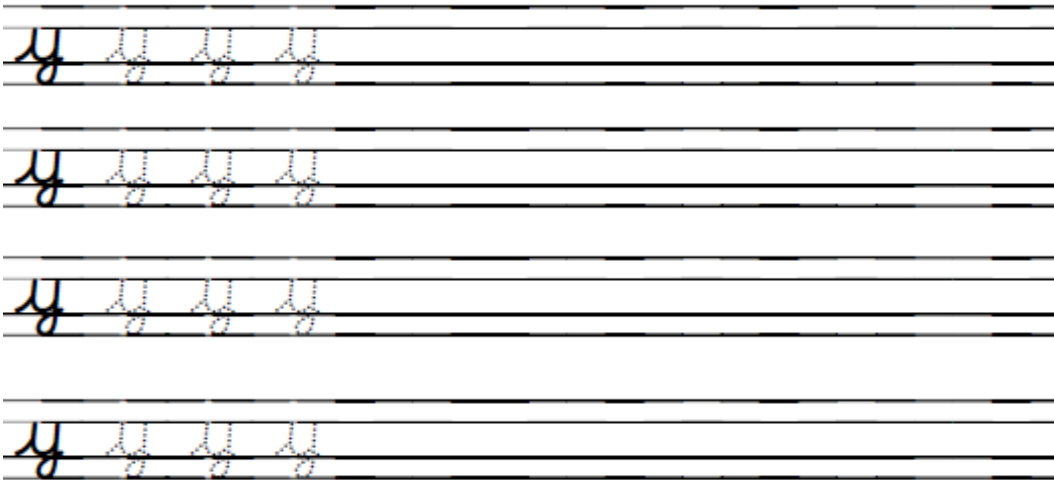
Handwriting & Fine Motor Activities
