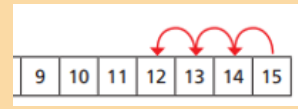
The number 8 has been partitioned into 3 and 5 so that the first tens frame can be made into 10. Then it is easy to do $10 + 5$

Subtraction – not crossing 10



Crossing out the numbers that you are taking away.

Subtraction – not crossing 10 (counting back)

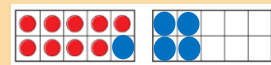


Using a number track, you can count back. Don't count the first number.



You have to cross ten, so you need to partition the subtrahend.
 $13 - 5 =$
 $13 - 3 = 10$ (count back 3 to 10)
 $10 - 2 = 8$ (count back the remaining 2)

Eva has 13 tokens. She wins 5 more. How many does she have now?



There are 9 children on the bus. 5 more get on. How many are there now?

$9 + 5 = 14$
