




Today you are going to be retelling the story of The Storm Whale. You need to think about your learning from the last two weeks about this story to help you.







Handwriting & Fine Motor Activities


It is really important that we keep up the strength in our hands so that we can continue to develop our handwriting and writing stamina. You will have fine motor activities and handwriting practice three times a week.

Trace over the letters and then have a go at writing them on your own. Remember to add a whoosh!



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

It is Fairtrade Fortnight. This Fairtrade Fortnight we are thinking about what we want the world to be and the ways in which we can make choices to shape the


world.
