
What is a main clause?

A main clause is one that can stand alone as a sentence in its own right. It must contain a subject and a verb and sometimes contains an object.

A subject is what the sentence is about and does the action.

A verb is a doing or action word. It is also a state of being.

The object is the thing or person that is involved in the action but not doing the action.



What is a compound sentence?

A compound sentence is a sentence that has two main clauses joined by a coordinating conjunction.


What is a Coordinating Conjunction?

A coordinating conjunction is used to join two main clauses together.

In Year 4, it is important that you use a wide variety of coordinating conjunctions.

At the moment, lots of you are only using and, but and so. You must get into the habit of using ALL the coordinating conjunctions.

We can use FANBOYS to help us:



Then the little girl travels with her seeds to another city, and another, and another, until her bag of seeds is stolen from her by another young thief, who makes the same promise.




The code is the same from last week.
