

Remember that half would mean half of the number. In this pictogram half is 2 because half of 4 equals 2.






A pictogram helps us to see information in a chart. We use a tally to gather this information.

#### What we need to do:

Interpret means to explain something. We can interpret pictograms in many ways by looking at the greatest/least, the difference etc.

This pictogram shows which car a group of people would most like to have = 2 person
