Reading

Reading levels have been assessed and as each child is different, they will have different needs when changing their book. They can change their book as and when they need to as well as bringing home a weekly library book. Everything has been placed into their home learning wallet which should still be brought to school daily.

Please continue to read with your child daily, ask them comprehension questions and sign their reading record for monitoring.

Spelling

We will continue to do daily spelling sessions, focussing on a different sound each week. Lists for the sound will come out on the Friday and we will do an informal spelling test on the following Monday.

Homework

Homework is sent home daily.

There will be some maths and grammar questions to complete.

We will mark answers the next day as a class and the books are checked every Friday by an adult.

An additional homework grid has also now been distributed to allow for longer and topic focussed projects, there is no set time for these to be done, they can be handed in as they're completed. Please try to complete a minimum of 4 tasks.

Numbots and Times Table Rockstars can continue to be used at home, passwords are in the back of the home learning journal.

PE & Outdoor Learning

Our formal PE lessons are on a **Wednesday** and a **Friday**. The focus is swimming and invasion games.

Please ensure your child comes to school wearing their **correct PE kit** on these days – Speak to me if you need any of the kit as we received many clothing donations in the clothing drive and can supply them.

Swimming is taking place at The Hayes every Wednesday. The swimming kit must include a swimming costume, swimming cap, towel and the option of goggles. I also recommend packing a plastic bag for wet items.
